This camp session is geared to the serious travel or select player who wants to hone his skills among the top youth players in his age level. Training is conducted by college coaches and players from the University of Evansville staff and is more intensive than the other day camps offered. Players may register individually or as a team.

Advanced Day Camp Boys, Ages U9-U12

June 7 - 11 • Half Day • 8:00 a.m. - Noon • Fee: \$150

Full-day campers are provided lunches Monday through Friday.

Check-in takes place on the first day of camp 8:30 - 9:00 a.m. at the Arad McCutchan Stadium entrance located on Frederick Street. All campers will receive an Aces Soccer Camp T-shirt and player certification.

Bathrooms and indoor space for shelter from severe weather is available. All campers will need to bring a ball, soccer cleats, and shin guards.

All campers should arrive before the camp program begins at 9:00 a.m. All campers get picked up on the field and must be signed out by the responsible person. Half-day campers should be picked up at noon. Full-day campers should be picked up at 4:00 p.m. Before and after care is available, at the Evansville site only, from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. and from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. for a modest fee.

The spring break camp is specifically designed for boys and girls in grades K through 6 who want to learn the fundamental skills of soccer while elementary schools are not in session for the spring recess. Full-day and half-day sessions are available. Emphasis on correct technique is reinforced by individual instruction. The learning environment is enhanced by small groups, which guarantee involvement. The newest teaching and coaching methods are presented in a clear, concise manner. Since each camper is required to have his or her own ball, there is plenty of time to perfect newly acquired skills. The fun-filled days are supervised, and a certified CPR and first aid staff member is always on duty.

The day camps are the first camp experience for many young soccer players and are designed to instruct in individual skills, tactics, and the fundamentals of team play. Aces Soccer Camp features a staff of capable instructors who can fully demonstrate each skill. Each morning begins with a demonstration of individual skills. Then campers break into groups by age level and ability and begin playing. Mornings conclude with matches in each age group. Full-day campers have lunch before attending the afternoon sessions; half-day campers leave prior to lunch.

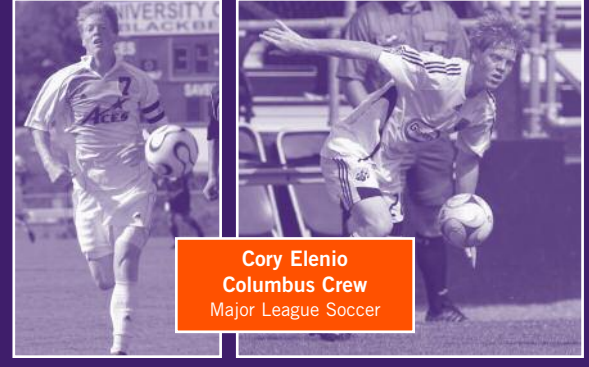

Focused training methods emphasize total development of both technical and tactical aspects of the game. In addition to all-around player development, training for specific positions and individual technical items are addressed. Campers are grouped by age and skill level in all training and game situations. Many University of Evansville Purple Aces soccer players started their careers at Aces Soccer Camp. Dustin Ortesen, once a camper, was a captain and all-conference selection at UE before going on to star for the A-League Indiana Blast.

Objectives

Residential Camp Boys, Ages 13-18

July 15 - 18 • Fee: \$525 – Boarder; \$325 – Commuter

Individuals and Teams Encouraged to Attend

Any and all participants, regardless of skill level, can attend the Residential Camp for Boys ages 13-18.

This developmental program features a highly competitive atmosphere for serious soccer players. Players are grouped by age and ability, and sessions focus on technical and functional position training, using small group and team tactics. The week features an ongoing team tournament in each age group, with evening matches on Black Beauty Field at Arad McCutchan Stadium. Coach Jacobs and other college coaches present a seminar on college recruiting geared towards the soccer player who wants to play at the collegiate level. Players will receive a comprehensive evaluation at the end of the session. Seminars held during this camp include the highly regarded college recruiting seminar as well as functional training sessions to prepare individual players for high school and college careers. Each camper receives an Adidas T-shirt and soccer ball.

The morning camp session begins at 8:30 a.m., and the day concludes with evening games, ending at approximately 9:00 p.m.

Goalkeeper Academy

Developed by Coach Jacobs, the Aces Soccer Camp Goalkeeper Academy is one of the finest in the country and is held during the residential camp. The specialized instruction includes specific technical, tactical, physical, and psychological training that is grouped with highly competitive game situations. With this methodology, Coach Jacobs has mentored several goalkeepers who have gone on to play for the United States National Teams, in Major League Soccer, in the Olympic Development Program (ODP), and at the highest collegiate levels. Coach Mike Miller assists in the direction of this program. Each goalkeeper receives an Adidas T-shirt and soccer ball.

The Residential Camp ends at noon on Sunday, July 18.

Facilities

The University's Black Beauty Field and Arad McCutchan Stadium is regarded by many as one of the finest soccer-specific college complexes in the United States. Evening games are played on well-lighted fields with plush Bermuda grass. A modern, well-equipped athletic training room is available for treatment of bumps and bruises.

Supervision, Housing, and Meals

Adult counselors supervise all campers off the field. Boarders are grouped by age and housed in modern, air-conditioned residence hall rooms on the UE campus. Coaches and counselors share the living facilities for around-the-clock security and leadership. Meals are served in UE's campus dining facility. Boarders receive three meals daily, and commuters receive lunch and dinner. Overnight campers must provide their own linens, including pillows and towels.

Cancellations

If circumstances or injuries make it impossible for you to attend our 2010 camp after you have sent in your payment, this fee may be applied in full to your 2011 camp fee.

If you fail to notify us in advance of the first day of camp that you will be unable to attend, the camp fee will be nonrefundable.

Assumption of Risk, Release of Liability, and Consent to Medical Treatment

As a condition of my child's participation in the Aces Soccer Camp, and in consideration for the privileges that come from participation in that camp which may include instruction, use of facilities and equipment, and other services provided by the Aces Soccer Camp, I hereby agree for myself and/or my minor child as follows:

- I recognize and understand that the Aces Soccer Camp is a coach's camp offered and operated by Aces Soccer Camp. The camp is not a University of Evansville sponsored activity and the University of Evansville does not have any responsibility for the operation of the camp.
- I recognize that the Aces Soccer Camp will involve various activities that may include, but are not limited to, instruction, conditioning, practices, games, meals, lodging, and travel to and from Aces Soccer Camp.
- I recognize that there are certain risks of harm associated with my child's participation in the Aces Soccer Camp and camp activities, that there are dangers that cannot be foreseen, that there are risks and dangers that the Aces Soccer Camp and its agents and employees cannot control, and that such risks and dangers could result in bodily injury or death to my child and/or to others.
- I understand that some of the dangers and inherent risks to my child in playing or practicing any sport include, but are not limited to, death, serious neck and spinal injuries which may result in complete or partial paralysis, brain damage, serious injury related to the eye and/or head, serious injury to virtually all internal organs, serious injury to all bones, joints, ligaments, muscles, tendons, and other parts of the muscular/skeletal system, and serious injury or impairment to other aspects of my child's body and general health and well-being. I further understand that there are risks associated with travel and that my child could incur some or all of these injuries during travel to and from the Aces Soccer Camp.
- I acknowledge that the Aces Soccer Camp has strongly recommended to me that my child seek medical advice concerning my child's physical health, conditioning, and abilities prior to engaging in any camp activities. I further acknowledge that my child does not have any medical conditions that would affect my child's fitness to participate in camp activities.
- I agree that if any injury or emergency should occur during camp with respect to my child, the Aces Soccer Camp staff is authorized to take whatever steps are reasonably necessary in their judgment to attend to my child's medical needs. I agree to be responsible for any hospital expenses, doctor's bills, or other expenses that may be incurred to attend to my child's medical needs.
- I represent that my child has adequate health insurance to cover the cost of treatment in the event of any injury that my child incurs during participation in the Aces Soccer Camp.
- I agree to assume all risks and responsibility for any and all claims for damages including personal injury or death, medical expenses, disability, lost wages, loss of earning capacity, and property damages which may be incurred by my child while engaged in camp activities.
- I agree to indemnify and hold harmless the University of Evansville, Aces Soccer Camp, Mike Jacobs, and their agents and employees from any loss liability, damage, or costs, including court costs and attorney fees, that they may incur due to participation in the Aces Soccer Camp, whether caused by my child's negligence, the negligence of others, the negligence of the University of Evansville, and/or the negligence of the Aces Soccer Camp (excluding the sole negligence of the University of Evansville).

In signing this release, I acknowledge and represent that I have carefully read the foregoing, that I understand it, and that I sign it voluntarily as my own free act and deed. No one has made any oral representation, statement, or inducements in order to get me to sign this document. I have had the opportunity to consult with my own legal counsel before signing this document.
